- Require a graduated series of responses, such as community service, drug treatment, or jail time, for minor, non-criminal probation violations.

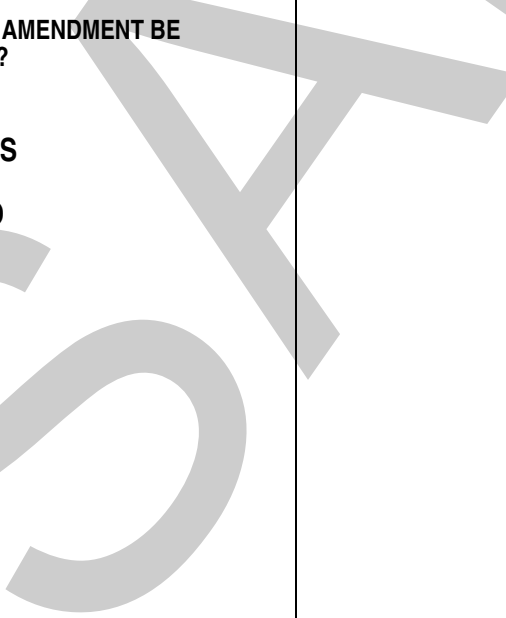
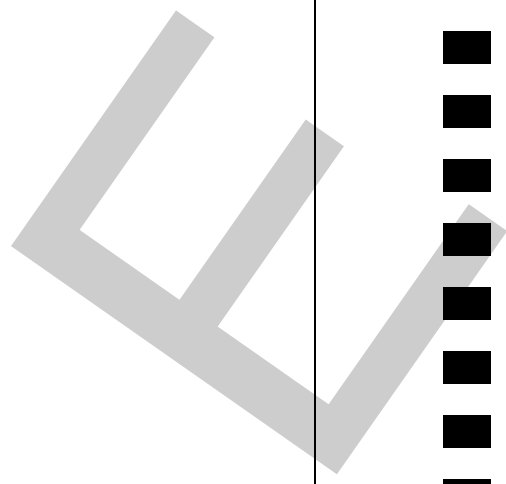
